# Tipp Monroe Community Services, Inc. Social Service Committee Program Review

**Those in attendance**: Carol Noffsinger (Chair), Carol English, Social Service Coordinator and Kathy Taylor, Director.

### **Items Discussed:**

- TMCS Social Service Brochure: Deleted Programs Shoes for the Shoeless; Loan Instrument Program –
  Instruments given to the High School Band Director; Coat Drive.
- Updated Social Service list given to clients in need. When completed we will send a copy to Carol Noffsinger for the Salvation Army.

# **Social Service Programs Reviewed:**

- Community Relief Program: Provides emergency assistances with rent, utilities and prescriptions, one time in a twelve month period. Currently we assisted families and individuals three times in a life time, not to exceed \$325.00 in that time frame. The amount hasn't changed in over 15 years. Increased from \$325 to \$500.
- Good Samaritan Fund: Assisting residents with gasoline went from \$20.00 to \$30.00; Carol English is discussing the possibility of using the Holiday Inn Express for the individuals needing lodging.
- Diaper and Formula: Increased from \$50 to \$75.
- Programs that did not change: Emergency Dental, Eyeglass (Carol is checking with the Tipp Eye Center, about a
  price increase from \$130 to \$175-200; Mobile Meals, Christmas in July; Lunch on Us; School Supplies;
  Community Outreach; Holiday Gift Giving.
- Lunch on Us: Need to hire a dishwasher for the summer. Lunch will be served in great hall this year.
